Parent responses	View point/ Question School reply in colour
Parent 10	<p>Will supporting other schools be disruptive to my child's education?</p> <p>No, the education of the children at Ravenscote is our number one priority. Any support we do with schools is strategically done. We have supported 3 schools this year and there has been no impact on our current children.</p> <p>How will the curriculum change? Will it be in line with secondary schools?</p> <p>These questions have already been answered in previous question responses. Please see them for the answer.</p> <p>Why were new year 3 parents not consulted?</p> <p>We have consulted our current parents and all the schools in Surrey Heath. We have a dedicated section on the website and are required to consult with our current parents. The local community are aware of the consultation as are the council.</p> <p>Will catchment area change?</p> <p>No our catchment is based on distance, we do not have a specific zone, it changes annually. Becoming an academy will not influence this.</p> <p>Will admissions policy change?</p> <p>We have no immediate plans to do this, and any change would take 2 years, following consultation. There are no changes for 2015 admissions as these are already set. They are the same as this year.</p> <p>Will sibling priority still exist?</p> <p>Yes</p> <p>Do we decide a feeder school?</p> <p>No</p> <p>Will you ask for a voluntary contribution?</p> <p>No. We only ask for contributions for trips and experiences, this will not change. We would not be asking for costs to help with the running of the school. Becoming an academy will enable us to create a greater commercial side to the school.</p>
