

**Consultation: Bourne Education Trust school admissions arrangements for 2027/28**  
**School: Kings International College**

**Introduction**

Kings International College (the school) is a secondary school in Bourne Education Trust (BET/the Trust). Bourne Education Trust delegates its role as the admissions authority for Kings International College along with the task of determining the school's admissions arrangements, to the school's Local Governing Committee (LGC) in line with the Trust's scheme of delegation.

**Consultation for Kings International College Admissions Arrangements 2027/28**

The school is consulting to amend its admissions arrangements with effect from the 2027/28 academic year to align with schools in Bourne Education Trust. The school will be adopting the admissions arrangements in their entirety; however, the previously agreed oversubscription criteria for the school will be retained. As a reminder, these are:

1. Looked after and previously looked after children.
2. Children with exceptional arrangements.
3. Sibling at time of admission.
4. Children of members of staff, employed at the school for two or more years at the time the application for admission to the school is made, and/or the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
5. Children who are eligible for the Service Children in Education Premium
6. All other children.

- parents of children between the ages of two and eighteen
- other persons in the relevant area\*\* who in the opinion of the admission authority have an interest in the proposed admissions

- all other admission authorities within the relevant area (except that primary schools need not consult secondary schools)
- whichever of the governing body and the local authority is not the admission authority
