Travel plan

About our school

Ravenscote School is located at the meeting point of the Old Bisley Road and Upper Chobham Road, Old Bisley has a 30mph and Upper Chobham has a 30mph speed limit as it passes the school. There is also a second entrance to the school via the Upper Chobham Road, which has a crossing patrol point before and at the end of the school day. The school benefits from a pleasant rural location, which does become congested at peak times due to the proximity of the M3 motorway and Blackwater Valley Relief A331 road system, with Camberley & Frimley town centres nearby.

The school is situated on the outskirts of Frimley and Camberley.

There are recommended cycle routes near Ravenscote School to Frimley and Camberley. There are also cycle routes to nearby Heather Ridge Infant School, Prior Ridge Infant School and Tomlinscote Secondary College. However, none directly linking Ravenscote School to the major catchment areas, due mainly to the very narrow footpath systems, especially along the Old Bisley Road.

Where are we now?

Road safety is a high priority for the school, along with all aspects of pupil safety. Ravenscote hopes to set a great example to other schools regarding our safe travel routes to school and road safety initiatives. In addition to road safety, children will also be learning about rail safety through resources made available via the Network Rail 'Switched on' website. Although no children use the railway to come to school, there are railway lines and crossing points in the vicinity, including a main line to London.

Seventy-two children in Year 4 are participating in Bikeability training in 2025. This is a huge improvement over last year when no children participated despite the training being offered.

In **Year 3**, children are given **Road Safety** awareness training, again this is provided by Surrey's '**Feet first**' programme. It offers all Year 3 children an opportunity to practice walking safely along the pavement and how to cross the road.

The school has a crossing point on Upper Chobham Road. This was installed in 2022. The **crossing** ensures children can cross the road safely at all times, by waiting for traffic to stop at the red light.

In our most recent whole school survey, of the 531 children who participated, 182 said they regularly walked to school and 11 cycled. This year we are continuing our efforts to increase the number of children using sustainable transport for all or most of their journey. In an attempt to address this, we will once again be offering the '**Walking bus**', beginning at Heatherside community centre and down Old Bisley Road, ending at Ravenscote school gates. In addition, we will be offering a bike bus. Initially as a one-off opportunity to test both its appeal and its feasibility.

What do we want to change?

- We would like to encourage more children to walk, ride or use a scooter to get to school.
- An official pedestrian crossing on the Old Bisley Road.
- Reduce the number of vehicles on the roads surrounding the school during school opening and closing times.
- Traffic calming on Old Bisley Road, particularly outside the main school entrance.
- Have a cycle path that travels to the school so that children can travel to school without having to go on the road.



- Resurfacing of pavements on the Old Bisley Road as they are in poor condition and a there is the potential for tripping or other accident.

Our Targets

- Ensure every child and adult in the school has appropriate road safety training.
- Educate children on the benefits of cycling, walking or coming to school on their scooter.
- Encourage parents, wherever possible, to walk their children to school through dialogue and offerings like the walking bus.
- Engage with the local council to explore the option of a traffic calming scheme on Bisley Road.
- Approach the local council about improving the condition of the pavements on Old Bisley Road.
- Update our mode of transport survey (Modeshift: Stars) and compare with 2022 results.

Next steps

Over the next year, we will be reviewing and updating the travel plan to identify areas for development and those which have been successful. Further consultations with children and parents about their mode of travel and how we might go about supporting increased use of sustainable transport.

We hope to involve the children in all aspects of the travel plan through the Eco and School councils to ensure every child has a safe journey to and from school.
